

1931-1946: RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

Fullerton, like most of Orange County, experienced very limited growth in the 15-year period that ended with the conclusion of World War II. Few houses were constructed, and most were modest in design with a Minimal Traditional style; only after 1940 does building activity resume in a significant way. One truly remarkable house was constructed at this time in the Streamline Moderne style, the Gamble House.

Residential subdivisions such as those of the 1920s, in which houses were built one at a time and had their own personality, were no longer being created.
