Decision on Fox Near? Council to Review Proposals

roject Fox has been foremost in the minds of the board members, as well as the public at large. It seems like we've been working on this issue forever and finally we may be getting closer to a decision one way or another. During the past few months we have been talking to

the citizens to get a sense of what they would like to see happen to the historic theatre. As in the past with the petition drive, the people we have talked with are overwhelmingly in favor of restoring the theatre to motion picture use with adaptive reuse of the retail space in the com-

plex. We have encouraged people to write letters to the City Council expressing their views and want to thank the Fullerton Heritage members who have done so. For those of you who have not acted on your desire to have the Fox saved, we know how difficult it is to actually write that letter, but try to voice your concern by sending a brief note or post card to the Council.

The historic significance of the Fox Theatre is well documented and we think indisputable. We have received support from many noted historians and preservation architects as well as the California Preservation Foundation. So the issue seems to be not whether to save the Fox, but rather how to do so.

On Tuesday, October 19 the City



At its annual planning meeting in September, Fullerton Heritage Board members discussed priorities for the coming year. The board will work on the following issues:


- 1* Continue the effort to save the Fox.
 - 2* Develop marketing strategy for 2000 calendar.
 3. Put National Register plaques on two Fullerton Buildings.
 4. Compile and distribute a resources directory.
 5. Establish plan for Fullerton Heritage sponsored guided walking tours.
 6. Establish guidelines for education for outreach to realtors and front-line city staff.
 7. Develop interest in register status for landmark properties. Target properties: Williams Bldg., Il Ghiotto (Red-Car Station), Self Realization Church.
 8. Develop Anti-Stucco Campaign.
 9. Perform survey of post 1950 structures for Potential National Register Status

Launer Room Closed During Construction; Access to Be Limited

The Launer Local History Room will be closed and most of the materials unavailable during the library's construction project. This decision was made because the construction will endanger the historical collection. The following Launer room collections will be available during the construction: the classified picture file, but not the negatives, the Haines Criss/Cross directories for north and south Orange County from 1971 to the present, and the Fullerton News Tribune microfilm and index back to the 1890s. We appreciate the community's support during this remodeling and look forward to providing enhanced service and facilities upon the completion of the project.

OC History Conference Planned

The Orange County Historical Commission and the History Department at California State University, Fullerton are sponsoring a history conference to be held on the CSUF campus October 22, 23, and 24, 1999. Titled "Building Bridges to Orange County History," the purpose of the conference is to build bridges of understanding between different groups now living in Orange County, such as bridges between the academic community and historical societies, between generations, between teachers and students, and between the past and the millennium.

The conference will include workshops on oral history, historic preservation, genealogy, and historical society management, as well as bus and walking tours of historic spots in Anaheim, Laguna Woods, Placentia, Santa Ana, and Yorba Linda. 

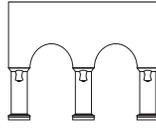

Council acting as the Redevelopment Agency will consider the efficacy of the responses to the Request for Proposals that was sent out this summer. Several proposals were submitted and all involve restoration of the theatre property in some form. While some proposals are better than others, all involve substantial financial commitment on the part of the developer, but request money from the Redevelopment Agency in order to successfully restore the

theatre. Because our efforts have shown that the citizens of Fullerton overwhelmingly support restoration including the use of public money if necessary, we will request that the Council contribute whatever is possible. If maximum Redevelopment Agency participation is needed for a successful Fox project, then it will be money well spent to insure future financial benefits to the city, supply the need for a downtown entertainment anchor and give the other downtown businesses the added boost that they deserve.

We urge all Fullerton Heritage members, and indeed anyone else who supports restoration of the Fox Theatre to join us at the **City Council meeting on Tuesday, October 19, 4 p.m. session, with the item likely to be heard at approximately 5:00 p.m.** Please come prepared to say a few words in support of the Fox restoration or to just lend your support by your presence that evening. We hope

to encourage the City Council to do the right and necessary thing to save the Fox for the citizens of Fullerton and for the benefit of generations to come. There may never be another opportunity to save

a piece of our cultural and architectural heritage that is so important to so many. If you have never been to a Fullerton City Council meeting, this is the one to attend.
